Gemma Lawrence is a writer and actor from London.

Gemma's debut play *Sunnymead Court* opened at the Tristan Bates Theatre in September 2020. It follows the story of two queer women who live in tower blocks opposite each other and begin a relationship from the safety of their balconies during the first lockdown. It was nominated for an OFFIE for Best New Play and named as a 2020 hit show of the year by The Stage.



Her second play *REWILD* was longlisted for the Women's Prize for Playwriting 2021 and the Theatre503 International Playwriting Award 2023. She was chosen to be a member of the Orange Tree Writer's Collective 2021-22, where she wrote her third play *Clown Clown Baby*, with dramaturgy from Guy Jones and workshopped by director Ned Bennett. Her TV pilot *Ribbons* placed in the top 10% for BBC Writer's Room in 2023.
