He was awarded two BAFTAS for 'Criminal Justice,' which was the basis for HBO's Emmy-winning series 'The Night Of,' starring Riz Ahmed. His most recent series for Showtime, 'Your Honour,' stars Bryan Cranston and '61<sup>st</sup> Street' with Michael B. Jordan as Executive Producer.
